Donal Sheehan outlined the work being done by the BRIDE project, how it evolved and their plans for the future. In particular, he spoke to the group about the Farming With Nature (not to be confused with the Farming For Nature group) and how they propose to ensure that farmers receive a better price for their produce when 10% of their land is dedicated to nature and biodiversity. Donal then brought the group on a walk through the farm, highlighting in particular the hedgerows which are never cut.
