## What information will we collect from you?

As part of the Creative Climate Action Project, *Corca Dhuibhne Inbhuanaithe*, we will be collecting some information from you as participants. This includes your contact details (name, phone number, address, and email address) and some information from you about your farming practices. As part of the project, we will also be taking photographs and video footage of you during our trips and farm visits.

## What will we do with that information, who will have access to it, and how long will we keep it for?

Your **contact details** will only be shared with those directly involved in the project and will not be shared outside of the Dingle Hub and the project team without your prior consent. We will use the contact details provided to keep in touch with you about the project and to inform you of events, webinars, trips and workshops. At the conclusion of the project, we will not retain your contact details for more than two years without further consent from you.

The **photographs** and **video footage**, in accordance with the consent form you have already signed, will be used to document and share learnings from the project. This would include on the Dingle Hub and Dingle Peninsula 2030 website, via press channels such as television, radio, newspapers, and online media such as websites. This information will also be shared with Creative Ireland, the funders of this project, and MaREI who are evaluating the project. There is no set end date for the sharing of this material but it will not include your personal contact details.

## How will we store it?
